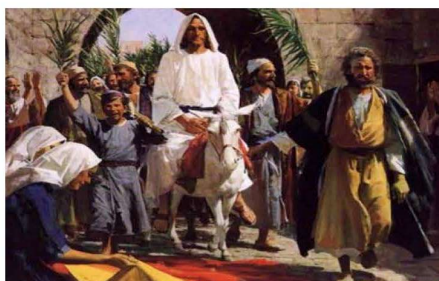

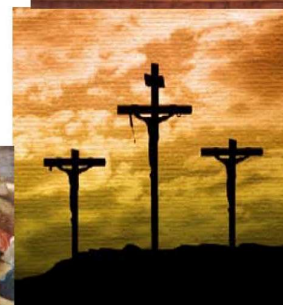
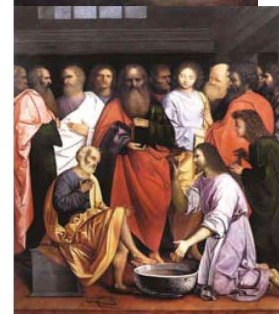

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17) The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 10, 2016) and Good Friday (March 25, 2016) are days of *abstinence* for all Catholics *over the age of 14*. On these two days, *fast*, as well as *abstinence*, is also obligatory for those *from the ages of 18-59*. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of *abstinence* from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance. Following are several resources that can aid in finding different forms of prayer and penance.

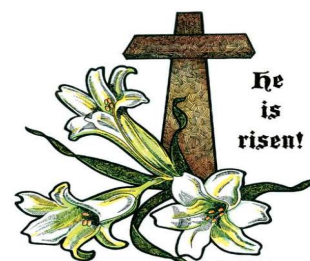

Dear Friends,

Here's a question you could be asked sometime at a trivia game that you may not know the answer to: How is the date for Easter determined each year?

The answer: It's the first Sunday immediately following the first full moon after the spring equinox. This year the spring equinox is March 20th and the first full moon following that date is March 23rd and the Sunday immediately following that is Sunday, March 27th; therefore, Easter this year is March 27th! So if you didn't know before how it got decided and you just went along with what "everyone else said" was the date for Easter, now you are "in the know" and you can figure it out all on your own in the future. Now isn't that fun!?!

It's then from the date of Easter we determine when Ash Wednesday would be and when Lent begins and we also determine when Pentecost Sunday will be, thus ending the Season of Easter. We also know that if Easter Sunday is March 27th, then Holy Week, beginning with Palm Sunday, is today March 20th.

Holy Week is unique from all the other weeks of the year by the liturgical celebrations and Church traditions we keep. While on Sunday we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem with the palms we have in hand for Mass and then remember His passion and cross with the gospel reading, it's the end of the week that are known to us as Christians as the holiest of days of the entire year.

Beginning Thursday evening and ending on Easter Sunday these days are known collectively as the Holy Triduum. We call them Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. Individuals in the past have asked if these are days of obligation for us to go to Mass since they are considered to be the holiest of days for us as Christians. Officially, no one is obligated to attend any of the church services these days, except of course Easter Sunday, but it would make sense for all of us to heavily consider participating in these liturgies on these holiest of days. I would invite you to consider for you and your family the times of the different services listed in the bulletin and make a special effort to attend. The gift of faith, by which we all by God's grace have been given and in which we share as a Parish family, is about these Holy Days. If it were not for these *original* Holy Days there would be no faith for us to have nor for us to share. It's important and good for us to remember and to celebrate each year what Jesus did out of love for us in order to make our lives one's with eternal purpose. I invite you to come this Holy Week and pray with us in preparation for our celebration of Easter next Sunday which will be the first Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox!
