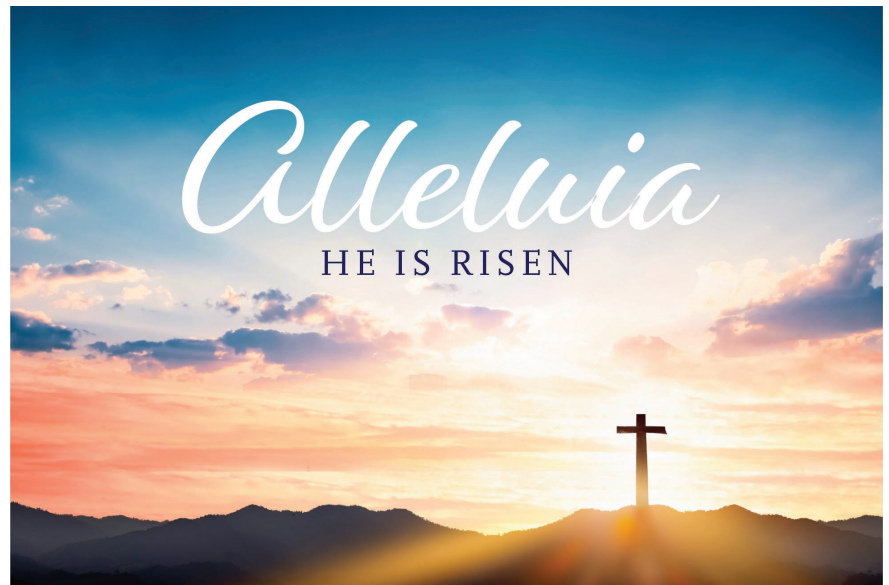

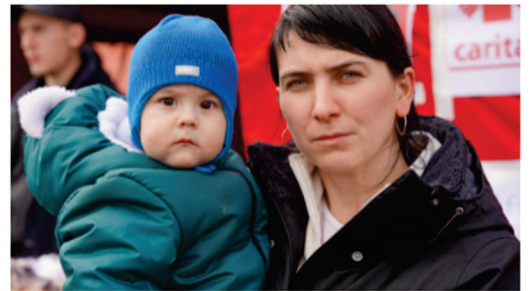
All Things New Education Survey Available For All Parishioners

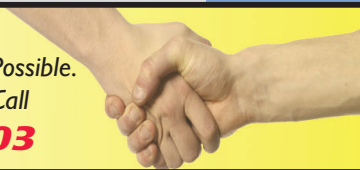
