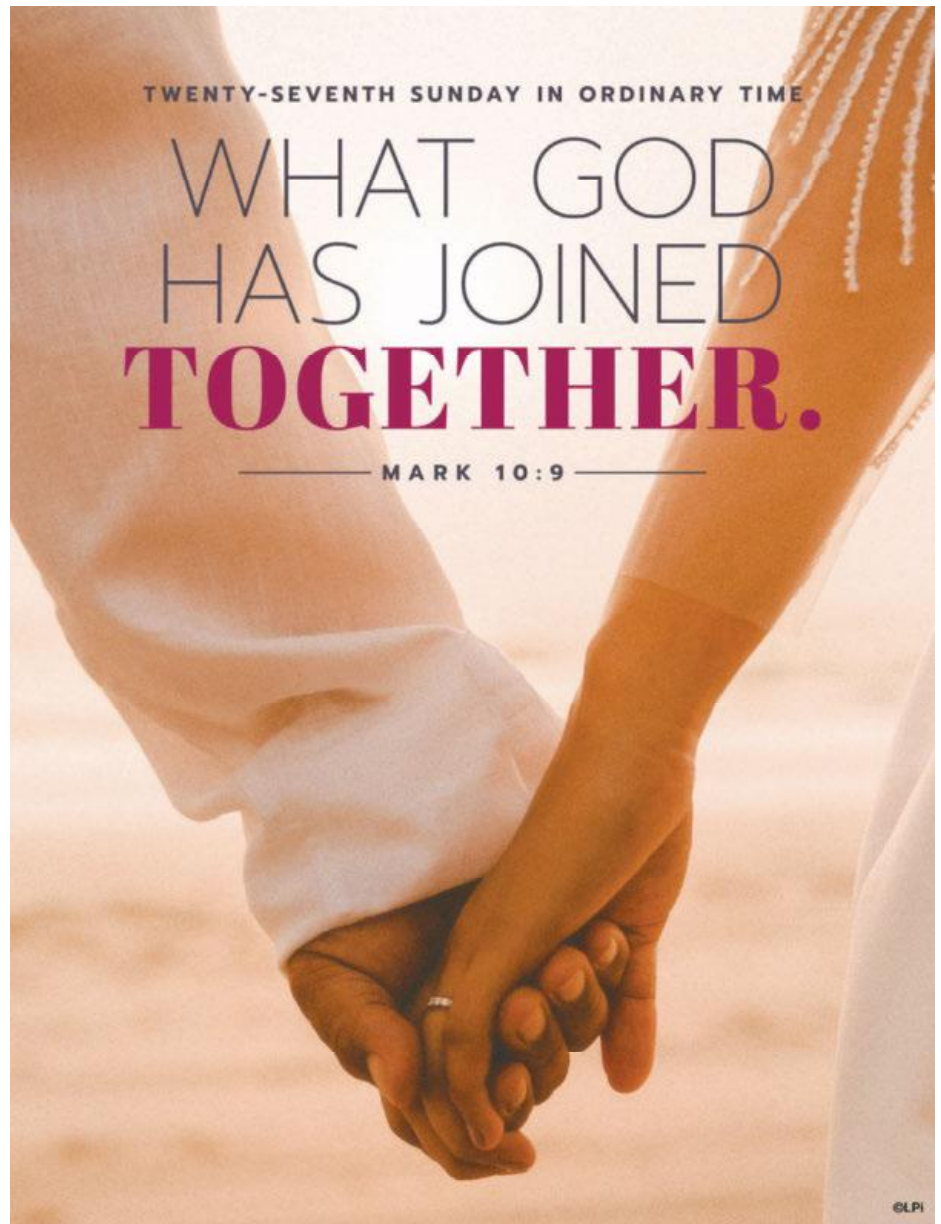

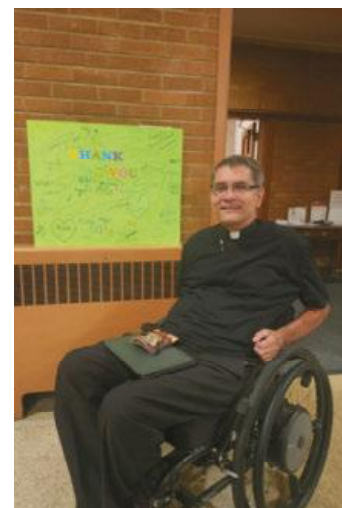

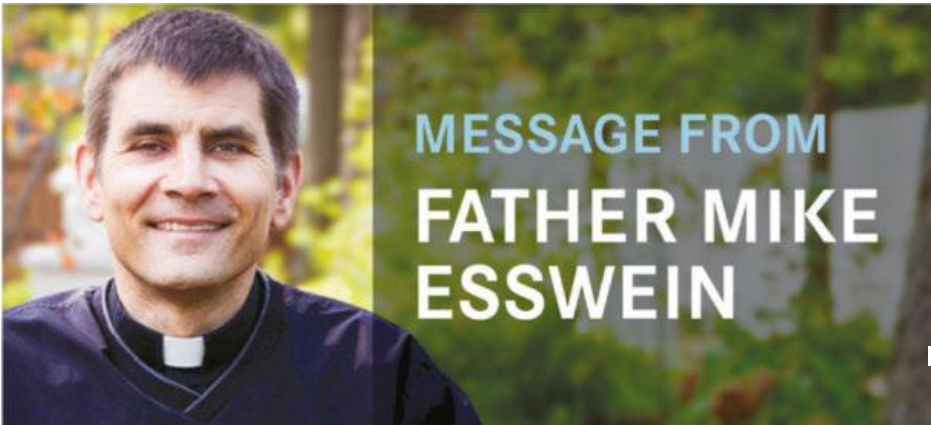
The Divine Mercy Chaplet

Dear Friends,

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7th.

According to Catholic tradition and history St. Dominic received the Holy Rosary directly from the Blessed Virgin in 1206. Because this was a new way of praying, our Blessed Lady taught him how to say the rosary and asked him to preach this devotion and to teach others to pray it as well. Since that time many victories, both personal and public, have been credited to the recitation of and mediation on the Holy Rosary.

In the 16th century when Christendom Europe was being threatened to the point of collapse by the ever-expanding forces of the Ottoman Muslim Turks, Pope Pius V called upon all Christian Europe to pray the rosary seeking the protection of our Mother Mary's prayers. At the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571, the Christian fleet defeated a superior Ottoman Muslim fleet and stopped the westward expansion of Islam in the Mediterranean. In gratitude to our Mother Mary, Pope Pius V instituted the feast of Our Lady of Victory, which later was named Our Lady of the Rosary, on October 7th.

It was then in 1883, when Pope Leo XIII officially dedicated the month of October to the Holy Rosary, making reference to the battle and the feast.

During this month of October, consider implementing this centuries old devotional prayer into your family or personal prayer life. Maybe pray a decade of the rosary after dinner with the family, or maybe pray the rosary once a week on Fridays, or maybe join fellow parishioners who pray the rosary in church during the week. At Annunciation the rosary is prayed daily before 8:30 AM Mass. At Providence it is prayed each Monday evening in church at 7:30pm.

Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us!

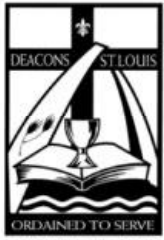

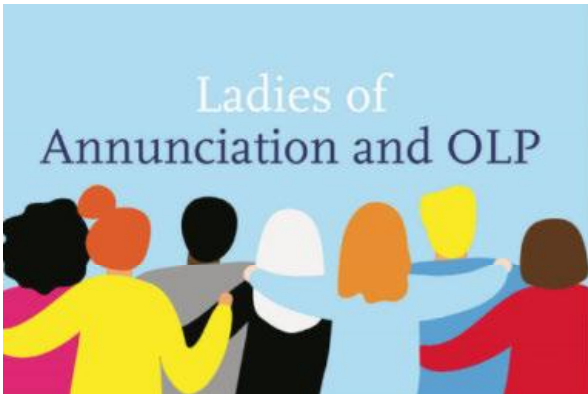


SAVE THE DATE: Ladies' Morning Advent Brunch and Reflection on Saturday, Nov. 30
